IF + Past Perfect, Perfect Conditional

(Would/wouldn't + have + Past Participle)

Usage

Imaginary situations in the past



- If I had got a gold medal, I would have been happy.
- If I had met Susan last week, I would have given

# THIRD CONDITIONAL

Formation:

If + past perfect, + would have + past participle

IF	CONDITION	RESULT	SITUATION
	Past perfect	Would have + past participle

f	I had known,	I could have helped.	Although this didn't happen, the result is only a possibility.

lf	you had known,	you should have helped.	Although this didn't happen, it is only good suggestion or piece of advice.

urveys show that kids are addicted to their smart phones and other mobile devices. So if it seems as if teenagers are spending a lot of time connected to their screens, that's because they are. About a quarter of their day to be exact.

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The average teen between 13 and 18 spends about nine hours a day consuming media and that is outside of their school homework. Kids aged 8 to 12, or tweens, are spending about hours in front of the They screens. watching shows, playing games, connecting on social media listening to music sometimes all at the same time.
